The City of Graz

- Graz, the cultural capital of Europe in 2003, is the second biggest city in Austria with approximately 300,000 inhabitants. The safe and culturally rich city has become a university city with about 60,000 students and is only about 200 kilometers south of the capital Vienna.
- The historical downtown and Eggenberg Palace are UNESCO-World Cultural Heritage sites. Graz has been a UNESCO "City of Design" and part of the "Creative Cities Network" since March 2011 – there are only ten other cities in the world who have received this distinction.
- Graz offers a high quality of life with the southern flair of its narrow alleys and open squares.





The City of Vienna

- Vienna is the capital city of Austria and also one of nine Austrian federal states. With about 1.8 Million inhabitants it is the most heavily populated city in Austria, known for its coffee and historical architecture.
- Several times, Vienna ranked number one as the world's best place to live.
- Vienna is an international congress and meeting location and seat of many international organizations. Due to its political and international importance, Vienna is considered a global city.
- The historical downtown and Schönbrunn Palace are UNESCO-World Cultural Heritage sites.
